Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2012-2013 educational progress for the Dr. Joseph F. Pollack Academic Center of Excellence (PACE). The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Darah L. The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

To date, our school has not been given one of these labels, (Reward, Focus, or Priority).

At PACE, we have overcome many challenges throughout the years. However, a remaining challenge has been the narrowing of student achievement scores as compared with all students across the state of Michigan. Despite the many challenges, PACE continues to show growth in student achievement in Math, Reading and Science, as listed below in the data tables in the Annual Education Report (AER).

- In the area of Math, we had a 6% increase in 3rd grade; 5% increase in 4th grade; 11% increase in 5th grade; 15% increase in 6th grade and a 4 % increase in 7th grade.
- In the area of Reading, we had a 10% increase in 3rd grade; 1% increase in 4th grade; 10% increase in 5th grade; 4% increase in 6th grade; 23% increase in 7th grade and a 8% increase in 8th grade.
- In the area of Science, we had a 9% increase in 5th grade.

In an effort to accelerate student achievement and close persistent gaps, the key initiatives being undertaken by PACE are:

- Building a stronger, rigorous and viable curriculum aligned with the Common Core State Standards.
- Building the capacity of teachers in the area of Differentiated Instruction and Response to Intervention.
- Continue with Small Group Intervention and provide one-on-one instruction to the Bottom 30% of students.
- Provide sufficient instructional time for Math, Science and Social Studies, by extending the school day and providing time for teachers to conference with students in order to provide timely feedback.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

As a public school academy, PACE provides education services to students who live anywhere within Michigan without any district boundaries. Parents must apply for admission to PACE and provide proof of birth date, current grade placement, address and contact telephone numbers. If enrollment numbers are met, a waiting list is established and a lottery is held if needed.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The annual School Improvement Plan (SIP) has been submitted to the State and is posted on the school website at www.pacek-8.org. The SIP is updated annually by a team of staff and parents who meet monthly to monitor progress on its implementation.

PACE follows the State of Michigan established curriculum. Mathematics and English Language Arts have been moved to the Common Core State Standards.


5. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent involvement is critical to the success of all PACE students. The teaching staff completes Progress Reports for each student quarterly and sends them home to parents who are then invited to attend quarterly Parent Teacher Conferences (PTC). Attendance at PTC averages approximately 85-90% (around 640 parents) per quarter. Parents are also invited to participate at Board of Director meetings monthly and at parent meetings bimonthly.
